I am the widow of John R King
 deceased, who departed this life on the 16 day of January A. D. 1900
 in the County of Jackson Co., in the State of Ala.

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to

the date of his death. I was married to him on the 17 day of April A. D. 1888
 in the County of Jackson Co., in the State of Ala.

My husband, the said John R King

enlisted and served in the military service. I have been a resident of the State of Oklahoma for over twelve months prior to February 25, 1915. 

K, 4th Alabama Infantry, C.S.A., enlisted April 27, 1861 (date of enlistment also shown as August 25 and as August 28, 1861), and that he was discharged October 7, 1862, at Richmond, Va., on surgeon's certificate of disability, the certificate showing that the "amputation of the left leg was rendered necessary by a gunshot wound received in battle on June 29, 1862, at Gains Mill, Va., while in the service and in line of his duty." No later record found.

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during said war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time voluntarily abandoned my post of duty in the said service; that I was honorably discharged ~~or surrendered~~ on the 25th Day of August = 1861 =

because of amputation of the left leg; caused by gun shot wound in battle on the 27th Day of June 1862 at a place called Gamers Hill in State of Virginia


