do hereby make application to the Board of Pension Commissioners for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Fifth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma and approved February 25, 1915, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of E. H. David deceased, who departed this life on the 9th day of October A. D. 1907 in the County of Johnston, in the State of Oklahoma

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 9th day of July A. D. 1874, in the County of Cook, in the State of Texas

My husband, the said E. H. David enlisted and served in the military service. I have been a resident of the State of Oklahoma for over twelve months prior to February 25, 1915. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever, money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$180.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of One Thousand Dollars, household goods and wearing apparel excluded, nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

No record has been found of the service, capture or parole of a man name Elihu Quaid as a member of Company C, 13th Regiment Texas Infantry, C. S. A. Rolls of the company on file cover periods from October, 1861, to December, 1863, inclusive.

The records show, however, that one Hugh E. Quaid (name also borne as E. H. Quaid and E. H. Quade), corporal, Company C, 13th Texas Cavalry, C. S. A., enlisted February 22, 1862, at Crockett, Texas. On the company roll for January and February, 1864 (last on file), he was reported absent, on furlough for 40 days from January 20, 1864. On a regimental return for April, 1865, he was reported, as a private, said company, on furlough for 34 days from April 28, 1865, in Houston County, Texas. No later record of him has been found.
