THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA,

County of Oklahoma

I, Mrs. Mary Ann Wade

do hereby make application to the Board of Pension Commissioners for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Fifth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma, and approved February 25, 1915, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of David S. Wade
deceased, who departed this life on the 20th day of October A. D. 1878,
in the County of Benton, in the State of Arkansas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to

the date of his death. I was married to him on the 28th day of March A. D. 1854
in the County of Clay, in the State of Missouri

My husband, the said David S. Wade

enlisted and served in the military service. I have been a resident of the State of Oklahoma for over twelve months prior to February 25, 1915. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever, money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$180.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of One Thousand Dollars, household goods and wearing apparel excluded, nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? 75 yrs
 2. Where were you born? Clay Co. Missouri
 3. How long have you resided in the State of Oklahoma? 25 yrs
 4. In what county do you now reside? Oklahoma County

5. Did your husband draw a pension? No.
- If so, in what State? no
6. What was your husband's full name? David S. Wade
 7. What was the date of his death? Oct 20 1878
- Where? Benton Co. Ark.
8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Missouri

9. How long did your husband serve? If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge from latter part of 1861
until June 1865,

10. What branch of the service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and the time of service Infantry

11. What was the letter or name of the Company or number of regiment, battalion, or battery of artillery in which your husband served

12. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.


