Care Notebooks

A care notebook is simply a 3 ring binder that:

- Helps maintain an ongoing, organized record of a child's care, services, providers, and notes.
- Maintains open lines of communication across multiple providers. Ensuring that any family accessing professional services could quickly and effectively provide a new provider with their basic information and history as well as current services being provided by others.

What to include:

An Emergency Information Form for Children with Special Needs – This form was created by the American College of Emergency Physicians and the American Academy of Pediatrics and is available as a PDF file at: <http://miemss.umaryland.edu/BusSafetyProgram/EmergencyInfoForm.pdf>

Information Organizers – Because this approach has already been adopted by several different states there are a variety of information forms already designed and available online. The following Web resources include packets of forms that can be used “as is” or adapted to meet individual needs.

Build your Own Care Notebook Online at the National Center of Medical Home Initiatives for Children with Special Needs Web Site. This Web site is designed to assist families to build their own care notebooks for their own children with special needs. The Web site allows parents to select different versions of care notebooks and put them together to build their own customized care notebook. A parent then has the capability to review up to 20 different versions of the subsections that they would like to include in their child's care notebook, and download those Word or PDF files to their computer. Early Settlement Mediation System – Northwest Program

Early Settlement Centers operate under the authority of the Oklahoma Dispute Resolution Act. The centers provide low-cost mediation to all who wish to negotiate interpersonal matters. To initiate mediation, each party must pay a five dollar processing charge as required by the Oklahoma Statue, except in cases ordered by the court. Cases resolved by mediation may involve money, property, business transactions, personal relationships, assault, harassment, animal disturbances, neighborhood disturbances, or other matters. The disputes may be with mates, ex-mates, other family members, neighbors, landlords or tenants, consumers or merchants. The program also offers “Peaceful Resolutions for Students”. The goal of this project is to train school representatives, including students to develop a peer mediation program in the school they represent.
