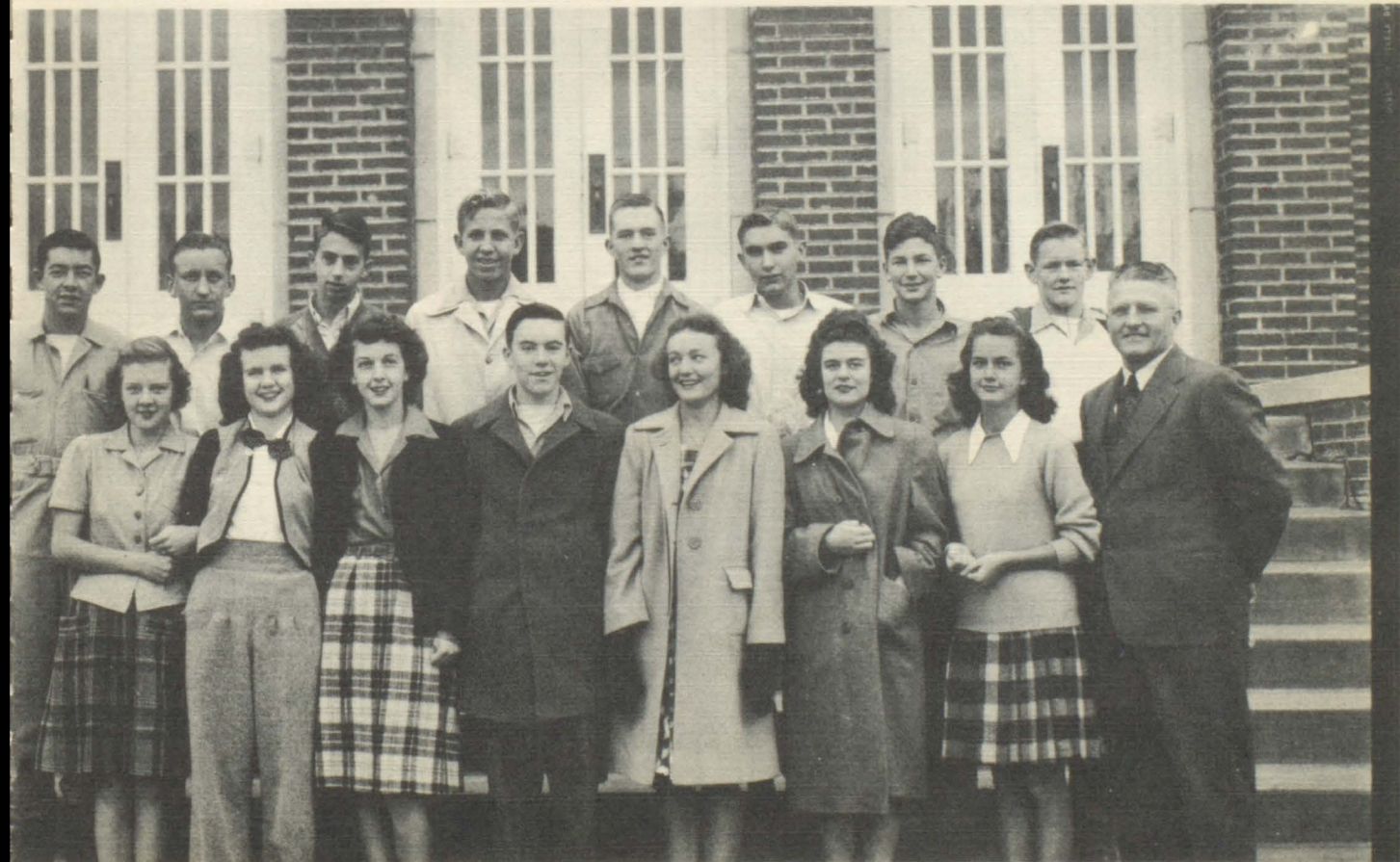
## FOREWORD
