HB2563 Principal Author(s): Hager, James E. Provides for alternative teaching certification for residential or treatment facilities.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2588 Principal Author(s): Beutler, Randy; Long, Ed States that the Oklahoma Historical Society may sponsor and administer state participation in the annual National History Day competition.; Emergency. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Education (S)

HB2601 Principal Author(s): Brown, Ben; Paulk, William R. Clarifies language relating to procedural requirements for the ouster of certain officers.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2604 Principal Author(s): Satterfield, Shelby; Wilkerson, Dick Modifies various references including those pertaining to driving across highway dividing spaces; the installation of blue lights on vehicles other than authorized emergency vehicles; and covering or otherwise overlaying vehicle license plates.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Transportation (S)

HB2611 Principal Author(s): Hamilton, James E.; Rozell, Herb Creates the Public and Correctional Facility Finance Act.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Appropriations (S)

HB2613 Principal Author(s): Douglass, Brooks; Paulk, William R. Modifies the condition by which murder in the first degree occurs.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2615 Principal Author(s): Douglass, Brooks; Paulk, William R. Stipulates that the only issues that may be raised in an application for post conviction relief are those that were not and could not have been raised in a direct appeal or those that support a conclusion that the outcome of the trial would have been different. States that all such applications must be filed within one year from the date the conviction is final, or in the case of an appeal, one year from the date the appellate decision is final. Specifies that the district court may not consider subsequent application unless certain information is provided.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Judiciary (S)

HB2619 Principal Author(s): Brown, Ben; Paulk, William R. States that a witness be prevented from disclosing the testimony of the witness to the attorney of the witness; states the prohibition against the witness disclosing the testimony shall cease upon issuance of the final report of the grand jury.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Judiciary (S)

HB2620 Principal Author(s): Davis, Frank W. Creates the Construction Division within the Department of Corrections.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2623 Principal Author(s): Cox, Kevin; Hendrick, Howard H. States that a group or combination of persons or risks shall not be considered a 'fictitious' group upon meeting the conditions provided within this section.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Business & Labor (S)

HB2633 Principal Author(s): Ferguson, Larry R. Provides that during temporary closure of state agencies, employees previously scheduled to work in the closed area will be placed on paid administrative leave or assigned to another work location. Clarifies that the appointing authority is responsible for determining the need for closure and shall be responsible for notifying the Office of Personnel Management of closure. Specifies that employees on paid administrative leave shall be on standby or on-call status during their normal scheduled duty hours and must respond to the demands of the situation as necessary.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Appropriations (S)

HB2647 Principal Author(s): Herbert, Dave; Mitchell, Bill J. Amends title language relating to The Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority providing funds for repairs to Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department properties.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Appropriations (S)

HB2658 Principal Author(s): Askins, Jari Modifies grounds for setting aside judgment in criminal cases to not include the grounds of misdirection of the jury or error in pleading or procedure.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2667 Principal Author(s): Leftwich, Keith; Stanley, Fred Reapportions the fees, taxes and penalties received from the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act to the General Revenue Fund and State Transportation Fund.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Appropriations (S)

HB2669 Principal Author(s): Hilliard, Danny; Roberts, Darryl F. Authorizes National Park Service rangers to make arrests with the same status as state or local law enforcement if it is believed the offender has committed a felony, misdemeanor or at the request of a law enforcement officer.; Emergency. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Judiciary (S)

HB2693 Principal Author(s): Graves, Bill States that prior to out-of-home placement, each child to be placed outside the child's home shall be tested for HIV and AIDS, and such information shall be included in the medical history of the child.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2698 Principal Author(s): Ervin, Mike Allows the Department of Human Services to charge a service fee to those obliged to pay child support to cover administrative costs; states that such fees shall be deposited into the Child Support Revenue Enhancement Fund.; Emergency. Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2707 Principal Author(s): Monson, Angela; Roberts, Larry D. States that prior to Jan. 1, 1997 the Board of Trustees of the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System shall establish rules and procedures enabling any participating employer to also participate in the Oklahoma Public Employees Deferred Compensation Plan; restricts multiple deferred compensation plans.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Appropriations (S)

HB2726 Principal Author(s): Hager, James E.; Wilkerson, Dick Authorizes local school districts and county or city-county health departments may enter into agreements related to assuring that a child who is returning to school after an absence due to head lice infection is no longer afflicted.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2774 Principal Author(s): Perry, Fred Prohibits ritualistic child abuse. Provides penalties.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Second Reading - Referred To Senate Committee, Judiciary (S)

HB2775 Principal Author(s): Ferguson, Larry R.; Perry, Fred Provides income tax exemption for 'new' corporations having a taxable income of \$25,000 or less.; Emergency. Advanced From General Order, Motion Adopted - House, Title Stricken, Third Reading - House, Bill And Emergency Passed - House, Engrossed - House
