States that all such applications must be filed within one year from the date the conviction is final, or in the case of an appeal, one year from the date the appellate decision is final. HB2633 Principal Author(s): Ferguson, Larry R.; Provides that during temporary closure of state agencies, employees previously scheduled to work in the closed area will be placed on paid administrative leave or assigned to another work location. Clarifies that the appointing authority is responsible for determining the need for closure and shall be responsible for notifying the Office of Personnel Management of closure.
