- HB2620, authored by Rep. Frank Davis, R-Guthrie, passed with a vote of 101-0 with an emergency clause.
- HB2658, authored by Rep. Jari Askins, D-Duncan, passed with a vote of 100-0.
- HB2693, authored by Rep. Bill Graves, R-Oklahoma City, passed with a vote of 99-1 as amended.
- HB2698 (floor substitute), authored by Rep. Mike Ervin, D-Wewoka, passed with a vote of 100-0 with an emergency clause.
- HB2726, authored by Rep. Hager, passed with a vote of 97-3.
- HB2780, authored by Rep. Davis, failed with a vote of 36-63. Davis made a motion for the measure to be reconsidered at a later legislative date.
- HB2804, also by Paulk, passed with a vote of 97 to 3.
- HB2805, by Paulk, passed with a vote of 98 to 0.
- Committee substitute for HB2851, authored by Rep. Dan Webb, R-Oklahoma City, passed with a vote of 61 to 34. However, the emergency clause failed. Title was stricken on the bill.
- HB2861, authored by Rep. Wanda Jo Peltier, D-Oklahoma City, passed with a vote of 100-0.
- Committee substitute for HB2873, authored by Rep. Larry Rice, D-Pryor, passed with a vote of 90 to 0. The title was stricken and the measure included an emergency clause.
- Committee substitute for HB2906, authored by Rep. Don Kinnamon, D-Stroud, passed with a vote of 97 to 0. The title was stricken and the measure was amended to exempt the State Insurance Fund from closure in view of hiring freezes.
- HB2922, authored by Rep. Doug Miller, R-Norman, passed with a vote of 98-0.
- Committee substitute for HB2930, authored by Rep. Shelby Satterfield, D-Tulsa, passed with a vote of 99 to 1.
- HB2938 (committee substitute) authored by Rep. James Hamilton, passed with a vote of 99-1.
- HB2975, authored by Rep. Russ Roach, D-Tulsa, passed with a vote of 99 to 0.
- HB3002, authored by Rep. Robert Worthen, R-Oklahoma City, passed with a vote of 99 to 1. Title stricken.
- Floor substitute for HB3008, authored by Rep. Debbie Blackburn, D-Oklahoma City, passed with a vote of 89 to 8. The measure included an emergency clause and was amended to include a facility in Tulsa as well as Oklahoma City.
- HB3009, authored by Rep. Robert Worthen, R-Oklahoma City, passed with a vote of 99-0.
- HJR1078, authored by Rep. Larry Ferguson, R-Cleveland, was adopted with a vote of 54 to 45. The title was stricken. The measure was reconsidered by members.
- HJR1095, authored by Rep. Mike Mass, D-Hartshorne, was adopted with a vote of 56-43 with the title stricken.
