HB2182 Principal Author(s): Mass, Mike; Stipe, Gene States legislative intent to protect the rights of child witnesses; defines terms; states considerations that must be considered before deciding to accept the testimony of a child witness; establishes who can be present during the testimony of a child witness; provides for accompaniment of a child witness during testimony.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/27/96, General Order - Senate

HB2188 Principal Author(s): Greenwood, Joan; Hendrick, Howard H. Modifies the definition of "medical savings account" to include that which is offered by the State and Education Employees Group Insurance Board; allows any funds remaining in a medical savings account at the end of a tax year to remain in the account for future medical expenses; provides for payment of account funds to the account holder in the event the employee is no longer employed; also provides for an option to retain the account after employment; also allows for transfer of account to a new employer without penalty; requires the board to offer a high deductible health benefit plan; provides employees participating in a deferred compensation plan the option of transferring those funds to a medical savings account.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/27/96, Do Pass (unofficial)

HB2189 Principal Author(s): Begley, Jack; Williams, Penny Requires the State and Education Employees Group Insurance Board to pay for medical services and treatment rendered by out-of-state hospitals at the same level paid to an in-state hospital if the insured employee was referred by a physician and it was the closest hospital to the employee's place of residence, unless the board has otherwise contracted with an out-of-state hospital.; Emergency; 03/27/96, Do Pass (unofficial)

HB2193 Principal Author(s): Hager, James E.; Long, Ed Allows school districts to create their own educational improvement plan; deletes required components of said plan; allows districts to request an exemption from any statutory requirement or State Board rule not related to bilingual and special education programs, health and safety provi-

sions, school finance, State Aid, pupil formula weights, teacher salary and teacher retirement, the Oklahoma School Testing Program and the Oklahoma Educational Indicators Program.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/28/96, Senate Amendments Pending

HB2227 Principal Author(s): Askins, Jari; Wilkerson, Dick Provides that a judge may issue a search warrant for an occupied dwelling if he finds evidence that the evidence is located on the premises between 10:00pm and 6:00am, the search is a crime scene search, or the subject of the warrant

is a fugitive or the subject of an outstanding warrant; states that search warrants for other than occupied dwellings may be served at any time without special direction.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/27/96, Signed & Transmitted To Governor

HB2231 Principal Author(s): Voskuhl, Sean; Williams, Penny Creates the Family Centered and Community Designed Services Act; states the most frequently identified problems experienced by families seeking to access services or receiving services for their children; requires certain agencies to implement the system for the delivery of services to children and their families as provided by said act; designates responsibilities for the Oklahoma Planning and Coordinating Council for Services to Children and Youth; modifies qualifications for service on the council; modifies duties of the Joint Legislative Committee for the Review of Coordination of Services to Children and Youth.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/28/96, Do Pass (unofficial)
