SB 510 Principal Author(s): Ferguson, Larry R.; Wright, Gerald "Ged" Relates to adoption; allows foster parent to petition the court to terminate parental rights.; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 05/08/95, Conferees Disagree

SB 513 Principal Author(s): Monson, Angela; Roberts, Larry D. Clarifies reference relating to the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System.; Effective Date: 07/01/95 Emergency; 05/08/95, CCR Read By Senate

SB 517 Principal Author(s): Monson, Angela; Roberts, Larry D. Clarifies language pertaining to the Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges.; Effective Date: 07/01/95 Emergency; 05/08/95, CCR Read By Senate

SB 537 Principal Author(s): Hastings, Chris; Robinson, Ben H. Relates to nursing; includes delegation of tasks to advanced unlicensed assistive persons in the definition of duties of registered nursing and licensed practical nursing; defines advanced unlicensed assistive persons as person who has completed a training program approved by the Board of Nursing; gives the Board the power to certify advanced unlicensed assistive persons.; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 03/14/96, Conferees Named - House, SB0537 (C) (Anthony, Breckinridge, Cain, Douglass, Gray, Hastings, Paulk, Roach, Robinson, Seikel, Stipe, Thomas, Williams).

SB 586 Principal Author(s): Key, Charles; Pierce, Jerry Changes the age requirements of the Militia of the State of Oklahoma from not being over the age of 70 to being one who is in good health.; Emergency; 04/18/95, House Amendments Read

SB 587 Principal Author(s): Monson, Angela; Paulk, William R. Includes advanced practice nurses in list of medical practitioners included in definition of prescription; includes advanced practice nurses in definition of licensed practitioner; specifies that advanced registered nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, certified nurse-midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetist, and advanced practice nurses such nurses may not dispense drugs but may dispense professional samples; allows such nurses to diagnose, prescribe, distribute, and administer medicines, devices, or treatments as defined by the Board of Nursing; requires such nurses practitioners to accept responsibility to practice in accepted manner for their profession.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 611 Principal Author(s): Pope, Clay; Price, Bruce Prohibits the Department of Corrections from entering into a contract with any private prison

facility for the incarceration of state inmates when the design and construction of the facility does not meet stipulated requirements.; Emergency; 05/17/95, Returned To Calendar - Senate

SB 616 Principal Author(s): Glover, Jim R.; Hobson, Cal Relates to intoxicating liquors; prohibits wholesalers from purchasing, ordering or receiving any spirits or wine from any distiller, winemaker, rectifier or nonresident seller who is not the primary American source of supply or the designated agent for the spirits or wine ordered or received; allows for intrastate transportation of wine.; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 04/04/95, Third Reading - House

SB 622 Principal Author(s): Dickerson, Larry; Steidley, Dwayne Modifies various provisions pertaining to the needs of people with severe disabilities.; Emergency; 05/15/95, Second CCR Read - Senate

SB 658 Principal Author(s): Hendrick, Howard H.; Morgan, Fred Creates the Oklahoma Uniform Prudent Investor Act.; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 05/08/95, CCR Read By Senate

SB 669 Principal Author(s): Anthony, Calvin J.; Robinson, Ben H. Renames the State Data Processing and Telecommunications Advisory Committee as the Telecommunications and Computerization Oversight Committee; brings all aspects of the state telecommunications industry under the auspices of the new committee.; 05/26/95, Third CCR Read By Senate

SB 670 Principal Author(s): Bonny, Jack; Price, Bruce Clarifies statutory reference relating to appeals to the State Board of Property and Casualty Rates.; Effective Date: 11/01/96 Emergency; 03/26/96, Report Progress (unofficial), Appropriations & Budget (H)

SB 679 Principal Author(s): Bonny, Jack; Gustafson, Bill Provides a one-time tax credit for investments in qualified electric motor vehicle property placed in service after 12-31-95.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/26/96, General Order - House

SB 680 Principal Author(s): Long, Lewis Jr.; Stottlemire, Gary Prohibits bear wrestling exhibitions and horse tripping events; provides for punishment and fines for violation; allows the arresting law enforcement agency or animal control office to take custody of all animals in possession of the arrested person. Any person who commits any assault and battery against a current or former spouse, an individual with whom the defendant has had a child, or former resident of the defendant's household shall be guilty of domestic abuse punishable by imprisonment in the county jail not ex-

ceeding one year or a fine of \$2,000 or both. Subsequent convictions may include 2 years imprisonment and \$5,000 or both.; Emergency; 03/19/96, General Order - House

SB 682 Principal Author(s): Dank, Odilia; Hendrick, Howard H. Modifies property exemptions from ad valorem taxation.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/26/96, General Order - House

SB 685 Principal Author(s): Adair, Larry E.; Leftwich, Keith Sets maximum speed and minimum speed limits for interstate and four-lane divided highways.; Emergency; 03/28/96, General Order - House

SB 687 Principal Author(s): Fisher, Ted V.; McCorkell, Don Jr. Modifies definition pertaining to aircraft excise taxes to include unscheduled services in the definition of "commercial airline."; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/26/96, General Order - House
