SB 1151 Principal Author(s): Henry, Brad; Weaver, Robert E. Requires cost of incarceration to be calculated and credited to the inmate's obligation for cost. Requires DOC to pay to the Crime Victim's Center 15% of any gross wages earned by an inmate in a private prison industries program.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 1152 Principal Author(s): Easley, Kevin A.; Hefner, Jerry W. Creates the Substance Abuse Prevention Program. Provides guidelines for children in need of supervision or delinquent.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/28/96, General Order - House

SB 1163 Principal Author(s): McCorkell, Don Jr.; Williams, Penny Changes name of act of "Educational Deregulation Act" to "Oklahoma Trailblazer Schools and School Districts Act." Removes some requirements for eligibility for deregulation, states limits for deregulation, provides limitation of number of districts and school sites that may be deregulated.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/26/96, General Order - House

SB 1164 Principal Author(s): Boyd, Betty; Horner, Maxine Modifies eligibility requirements related to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program. Redesignates some duties from the State Department of Education to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/28/96, General Order - House

SB 1166 Principal Author(s): Long, Ed; Voskuhl, Sean Requires disclosure of actual payments if copayments are based on discounted or nondiscounted charges; requires explanation of benefits and copayments to clearly and accurately disclose actual amount paid or to be paid.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/25/96, General Order - House

SB 1167 Principal Author(s): Long, Lewis Jr.; Steidley, Dwayne Provides regulations relating to simulcast races and fair associations licensed to conduct race meeting; clarifies days considered racing days. Provides for percentage of winnings to be received from wagering and provides for distribution of such moneys. States Oklahoma does not conduct live racing.; Emergency; 03/26/96, General Order - House

SB 1175 Principal Author(s): Blackburn, Debbie; Cain, Bernest Excludes collection of child support from statute of limitations; provides for liens against property; prevents child support from becoming dormant for any purpose. Clarifies language of bill regarding child support.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/20/96, General Order - House

SB 1177 Principal Author(s): McCorkell, Don Jr.; Williams, Penny Provides that any license holder of a nursing home who has been cited more than three times for deficiencies which lead to enforcement action and penalties, or found to be out of substantial compliance with the requirements of any statute or rule, will not be deemed a person responsible or suitable to operate or direct such a facility.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 1184 Principal Author(s): Askins, Jari; Kerr, Robert M. Allows person between the ages of 13 and 17 to be tried as an adult if convicted of specified crimes; states that said convicted juvenile shall be housed in a separate facility.; Emergency; 03/21/96, General Order - House

SB 1185 Principal Author(s): Hastings, Chris; Smith, Jerry L. Allows for destruction of all paper records that have been microfilmed.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 1188 Principal Author(s): McCorkell, Don Jr.; Williams, Penny Modifies language pertaining to the Oklahoma Futures.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 1192 Principal Author(s): Adair, Larry E.; Herbert, Dave Creates the Oklahoma Tourism and Passenger Rail Act; creates the Oklahoma Tourism and Passenger Rail Advisory Committee within the Department of Transportation; creates the Oklahoma Tourism and Passenger Rail Revolving Fund.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/28/96, General Order - House

SB 1200 Principal Author(s): Askins, Jari; Wilkerson, Dick Authorizes the establishment of drug courts in the district courts of the state; provides for funding.; Emergency; 03/20/96, General Order - House

SB 1201 Principal Author(s): Long, Lewis Jr.; Roach, Russ Modifies language relating to county commissioners.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/25/96, Do Pass Failed (unofficial), Rules (H)

SB 1207 Principal Author(s): Cain, Bernest; Seikel, Mark Authorizes the Department of Human Services to give consent for medical examinations and tests and the release of test results to placement providers.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/21/96, General Order - House

SB 1209 Principal Author(s): Askins, Jari; Helton, Sam Modifies references relating to vehicle inspection fees.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/18/96, General Order - House

SB 1215 Principal Author(s): Easley, Kevin A.; Hutchison, Joe J. States that no person shall operate any vessel on any waters in the state while under the influence of any substance listed in the Uniformed Controlled Substances Act or any combination of alcohol and said substance; authorizes the Grand River Dam Authority to set maximum lake speed limits; states that no person shall operate any vessel on any waters of the state, except those that are privately owned, at speeds in excess of those established.; Emergency; 03/18/96, General Order - House

SB 1218 Principal Author(s): Settle, Bill; Smith, Jerry L. Provides procedure for the construction of duplicate sections of law relating to statutes and reports.; Emergency; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 1223 Principal Author(s): Anthony, Calvin J.; Robinson, Ben H. States that the Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall have the power and duty to, in conjunction with the Oklahoma Medicaid Healthcare options system, review and evaluate State Medicaid Program eligibility and enrollment guidelines in relation to federal regulations.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 1224 Principal Author(s): Langmacher, Ron; Price, Bruce Requires all sales of aluminum or aluminum alloy be reported, except for the sale of aluminum cans.; Effective Date: 11/01/96; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 1225 Principal Author(s): Easley, Kevin A.; Rice, Larry Adds definitions relating to environment and natural resources; expands jurisdiction of the Conservation Commission to include recipients of nonpoint pollution funds; states availability of the related revolving funds.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/27/96, General Order - House

SB 1227 Principal Author(s): Robinson, Ben H.; Stanley, Fred Extends benefits of the State and Education Employees Group Health and Life Insurance to board members of any rural water, sewer, gas or solid waste management district or nonprofit water corporation.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/28/96, General Order - House

SB 1228 Principal Author(s): Pope, Clay; Price, Bruce Relates to the Teachers' Retirement System; allows for current contributing members who withdrew their accumulated contributions may amortize the cost of returning the withdrawn contributions or unremitted contributions over a period not to exceed sixty (60) months.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency; 03/28/96, General Order - House
