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HB2232, by Weedn, requires that within 20 days after a proposed charter from a board of freeholders, a municipal governing body shall publish the proposed charter and an announcement of the date of the charter election in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality once per week for three consecutive weeks. The measure passed with a vote of 46 to 0.

HB2252, by Sen. Keith Leftwich, D-Oklahoma City, changes the required measurement for motorcycle headlamps from not more than 54 inches nor less than 22 inches. The measure passed with a vote of 35 to 10.

HB2336, by Sen. Robert Kerr, D-Altus, allows for university and college supporting license plates to include those of private universities. The measure passed with a vote of 45 to 0.

HB2530, by Sen. Ed Long, D-Enid, states that a partial term of not more than eighteen months for a member of the board of trustees of a library system shall not be considered a full term. The measure and its emergency clause passed with a vote of 45 to 1.

HB2541, by Smith, modifies requirements of nonlawyer judges as they relate to the filing of traffic violation reports with the Department of Public Safety. It also reduces the number of hours of continuing legal education required from twelve hours to six hours, which includes attendance of at least one day of state judicial conference from a judge. The measure passed with a vote of 46 to 0.

HB2561, by Weedn, deletes the requirement that a lien entry form be prescribed by the Oklahoma Tax Commission. The measure passed with a vote of 46 to 0. Weedn filed a motion to reconsider, giving her three legislative days to readdress the measure.

HB2604, by Wilkerson, modifies references relating to driving across highway dividing spaces, the installation of blue lights on vehicles other than authorized emergency vehicles and covering or otherwise overlaying vehicle license plates. The measure and its emergency clause received a vote of 46 to 0.

HB2745, by Stipe, directs the Department of Transportation County Advisory Board to establish a maximum purchase allocation for participating in counties. It also directs the board to establish an interest rate that may be charged on all leases or lease-purchase agreements. The measure passed with a vote of 47 to 0.

HB2918, by Smith, provides for assistant and special assistant district attorneys to be named state officers and details the responsibilities of the position. The measure and its emergency clause passed with a vote of 46 to 0.

HB3000, by Sen. Don Rubottom, R-Tulsa, declares "Oklahoma My Native Land" as the official children's song of the state. The measure passed with a vote of 45 to 0.

HB3028, by Wilkerson, states that any written bill of sale, timber deed or timber contract shall be preserved by the owner or operator of a logging or timber harvesting operation for at least a period of three years. Within that period, law enforcement personnel may inspect records. The measure and its emergency clause passed with a vote of 45 to 0.

HJR1077, by Sen. J. Berry Harrison, D-Fairfax, designates U.S. Highway 64, from Pawnee west, to U.S. 177 as the Pawnee Bill Memorial Highway. The measure was adopted with a vote of 45 to 0.

HCR1064, by Sen. Kevin Easley, D-Broken Arrow, states legislative intent concerning the creation of the Oklahoma International Bluegrass Festival. The measure was adopted.

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
