HB1022 Principal Author(s): Helton, Sam; Kirby, Ron M. Modifies language in regard to establishing the criteria for the use of the State Veterans Cemetery.; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 04/05/95, Senate Amendments Pending

HB1032 Principal Author(s): Cox, Kevin; Leftwich, Keith Makes it unlawful for any person to pay or be paid any form of compensation or remuneration for the circulation of an initiative or referendum petition. This act will be known as the "Ban the Bounty for the Initiative and Referendum Process Act of 1995."; Emergency; 04/19/95, Senate Amendments Pending

HB1054 Principal Author(s): Satterfield, Shelby; Weedn, Trish Defines the Department of Corrections as a law enforcement agency. Eng. Sen. Amend. strikes the title.; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 04/06/95, Senate Amendments Pending

HB1127 Principal Author(s): Adair, Larry E.; Kerr, Robert M. Relates to soldiers and sailors; removes the requirement that three of the nine members of the War Veterans Commission of Oklahoma be veterans of the Vietnam Conflict; provides that the term "war veteran" shall apply to any honorably discharged person who served on active duty in any branch of the military or naval services of the United States during a period of war, campaign, or expedition in which the United States Participated, and were awarded service medals as authorized by the United States Department of Defense; makes exempt from licensing from the Director of the

Wildlife Conservation Department those persons who are legal resident veterans having disability of 50% or more.; Effective Date: 07/01/95 Emergency; 05/25/95, Returned To Calendar - House

HB1136 Principal Author(s): Cole, Helen; Webb, Dan Requires additional information by state contract bidders or service providers regarding ownership of business entity.; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 04/17/95, Returned To Calendar - House

HB1138 Principal Author(s): Dickerson, Larry; Steidley, Dwayne Creates the Truth in Sentencing Act to assure persons convicted of violations of the law receive sentences that truthfully present the punishment actually to be exacted.; Effective Date: 07/01/95 Emergency; 04/17/96, CCR Submitted To House

HB1145 Principal Author(s): Henry, Brad; Smith, Dale Relates to schools; expands the powers of the board of education for each school district to incur all expenses within the limitations provided for by law, necessary, convenient, useful or economical to perform all powers granted; Eng. Sen. Amend. strikes the enacting clause.; Effective Date: 07/01/95 Emergency; 04/25/95, Returned To Calendar - House

HB1151 Principal Author(s): Leist, M. C.; Shurden, Frank Relates to Agriculture; creates the "Oklahoma Right-to-Farm Act" to reduce the loss to the state of its agricultural resources by limiting the circumstances under which agricultural activities may be regulated or deemed to be a nuisance.; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 05/08/95, Returned To Calendar - House

HB1156 Principal Author(s): Bryant, John; Hendrick, Howard H. Creates the Task Force on Early Retirement Incentives for State Employees.; Emergency; 05/08/95, Returned To Calendar - House

HB1225 Principal Author(s): Easley, Kevin A.; Rice, Larry Relates to oil and gas; provides a penalty for filing a false well plugging or inspection report. Eng. Sen. Amen. strikes enacting clause and increases penalties; Effective Date: 11/01/95; 05/08/95, CCR Submitted To House

HB1229 Principal Author(s): Easley, Kevin A.; Rice, Larry Relates to the Corporation Commission and the Senior Utility Rate Analyst position; deletes salary requirements, qualifications and duties of the position. Requires local exchange carriers to classify telephone service furnished to amateur radio clubs as residential service.; Effective Date: 07/01/95 Emergency; 04/11/95, Senate Amendments Pending

HB1238 Principal Author(s): Crocker, Ed; Easley, Kevin A.; Relates to public finance; requires the disclosure of the identity of any public official or spouse that is an owner or operator or who is a principal of any legal entity which owns or operates a project or who has any financial interest, whether direct or indirect, in the project that no conflict of interest exists because of the public official's or any person who was public official during the immediately preceding 24 months; requires that a list of all political campaign contributions made in Oklahoma during the 48 months immediately preceding the submission of the application of all persons that will have a financial interest in the project.; Effective Date: 01/01/97.05/06/96, Fur-
