**HCR1062** Declares March 1996 as "Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Month."

**HCR1063** Declares certain powers of the OK Dept. of Trans. are limited. Provides discretionary measures for use of revolving funds. Provides for discretionary spending of the OK Railroad Maintenance Revolving Fund.

**HCR1064** A concurrent resolution stating legislative intent concerning the creation of the Oklahoma International Bluegrass Festival.

**HCR1065** A Concurrent Resolution congratulating Shawntel Smith for her outstanding achievement in winning the current Miss America title.

**HCR1066** Recognizing the importance of creating quality jobs in Oklahoma, congratulating Project 1000 and encouraging more business people to participate.

**HCR1070** Declares the City of Muskogee as the seat of Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame and recognizes it as a focal point for tourism in Eastern Oklahoma.

**HCR1071** Proclaims the Legislature's support of a sports museum in the City of Guthrie.

**HCR1072** Mourns the loss of a dedicated volunteer servant of the state, Nathaniel Quinn; expressing condolences and extending deepest sympathy to the family members of Nathaniel Quinn; directing distribution.

**HCR1073** Supports and encourages safety education in the classroom; directing distribution.

**HCR1077** Declares Tuesday, April 9, 1996, as "International Student Awareness Day"; recognizing international students and commending all persons involved in international student programs; and directing distribution.

**HCR1081** Congratulates Representative Bob Plunk and his bride, Wanita, on the occasion of their wedding; expressing best wishes for a wonderful life together.

**HCR1083** Praises the life and career of Rep. Bill Widener. Expresses sorrow and condolences for his untimely death.

**HCR1084** Praises the efforts of Henry Jo Von Tungeln to promote the wheat industry and agriculture in general.

**HCR1085** Declares April 1, 1996, as "Alternative Education Day".

**HCR1088** Commends and congratulates the 1995 Conegie High School Wildcat boys basketball team.

**HCR1092** Memorializes the Congress of the United States to amend the federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act and the Public Health Service Act to facilitate the

development and approval of new drugs and biologics and directs distribution.

**HCR1093** Designates portions of State Highways 51 and 74 as the "Angie Debo Memorial Highway."

**HCR1094** Requests the US Department of Agriculture to authorize haying and grazing of certain federal conservation reserved lands.

**HCR1095** Expresses appreciation for President Bill Clinton's continued support since the bombing of the federal building on April 19, 1995.

**HCR1099** Designates the bridge crossing Leader Creek on State Highway 48 as the Vernon Sweat Memorial Bridge.

**HCR1100** Designates new bridge on State Highway 1 as the Pete Gray Memorial Bridge.

**HCR1102** Designates the first full week in May as Suicide Prevention Awareness Week.

**HCR1107** Withdraws HB3008 from the Governor's desk.

**HCR1112** Praises and commends Donna Nigh for her service as First Lady and work for the developmentally disabled.

**HR1045** Expresses the position of the House of Representatives that avowed homosexuals should not be permitted to adopt or engage in foster care.

**HR1048** Relates to House Rules; states that the vote on recommendation for final passage out of committee to the House shall be by roll call vote.

**HR1049** Provides for the temporary personnel of the House of Representatives and for payment of necessary expenses of committees, delegations and individuals traveling to and from points outside the state on trips authorized by the Speaker of the House.

**HR1051** A resolution expressing pride in John E. Kirkpatrick for his generosity and for his major contributions and wishing him much happiness on his 88th birthday.

**HR1052** A resolution requiring measure numbers and short titles on measure considered by the Oklahoma House of Representatives to be made available on the Internet.

**HR1053** Requires measure numbers and short titles on measures considered by the Oklahoma House of Representatives be made available via the Internet.

**HR1054** A Resolution condemning certain actions by television station WSB-TV and the Atlanta, Georgia police force; directing distribution.

**HR1055** A Resolution proclaiming American Diabetes Alert Day; and directing distribution.

**HR1056** Commemorates the 75th birthday of Imogene Storms Johnson.

**HR1058** Observes the National Day of Prayer.

**HR1059** Requests reconsideration of the decision to close the depot at Valliant, Oklahoma.

**HR1060** Declares March 20, 1996 to be Ag Day in Oklahoma.

**HR1061** Praises and commends the work of the staff of the Public Utility Division of the Corporation Commission on the local telephone competition rules.

**HR1062** Commends and congratulates H.E. "Gene" Rainbolt for his activities in behalf of the State of Oklahoma.

**HR1063** Commends the Honorable Larry Warden, chief clerk/administrator of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, for his election as president of the American Society of Legislative Clerks and Secretaries.

**HR1069** Honors older Oklahomans. Celebrates Older American Month. Declares May to be Older Oklahomans Month.

**SCR36** Authorizes the Board of Regents of Tulsa Junior College to issue revenue bonds, not to exceed the sum of Twelve Million Dollars.

**SCR 37** Extends the Electric Utility Task Force until Dec. 31, 1996.

**SCR39** Resolution honoring Jim Thorpe; declares Jim Thorpe "America's athlete of the century."

**SCR 40** Authorizes the Board of Regents of Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges to issue certain revenue bonds.

**SCR 41** Honors Oklahoma Future Business Leaders of America and declares Feb. 11-17 as "Future Business Leaders of America Week."

**SCR 42** Creates a task force to study the current and long term financial condition of the Oklahoma Teacher's Retirement System. The force will also advise the Executive branch and Legislative branch on alternatives to solving problems.

**SCR 43** Recognizes Dr. Roy Peters as the nation's most Outstanding Vocational Educator.

**SCR 45** States the intent of the Legislature relating to school board members' terms in office.

**SCR 48** Honors the memory of the late Doc Tate Nevaquaya.
