

Executive Action – Signed

SB1147 Prohibits the use of accident reports for commercial use. (05/23/96)

SB1162 Declares the University Center at Tulsa and Rogers State College to be a single institution; transfers supervision, management and control of the University Center at Tulsa and Rogers State College from the Board of Trustees of University Center at Tulsa and the Board of Regents of Rogers State College to the Board of Regents of University Center at Tulsa and Rogers State College; defines the regents' members; set terms of office for future regents. (03/13/96)

SB1164 Modifies eligibility requirements related to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program. Redesignates some duties from the State Department of Education to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. (04/18/96)

SB1167 Provides regulations relating to simulcast races and fair associations licensed to conduct race meetings; clarifies days considered racing days. Provides for percentage of winnings to be received from wagering and provides for distribution of such monies. (05/14/96)

SB1175 Excludes collection of child support from statute of limitations. (05/23/96)

SB1185 Allows for destruction or donation of certain court records that have been microfilmed. (05/16/96)

SB1192 Principal Author(s): Adair, Larry; Herbert, Dave; Creates the Oklahoma Tourism and Passenger Rail Act; creates the Oklahoma Tourism and Passenger Rail Advisory Committee within the Department of Transportation; creates the Oklahoma Tourism and Passenger Rail Revolving Fund. (05/28/96)

SB1207 Authorizes the Department of Human Services to give consent for medical examinations and tests and the release of test results to placement providers. (05/21/96)

SB1223 States that the Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall have the power and duty to review and evaluate State Medicaid Program eligibility and enrollment guidelines in relation to federal regulations. (05/23/96)

SB1224 Requires all sales of aluminum or aluminum alloy be reported, except for the sale of aluminum cans. (04/15/96)

SB1245 Modifies language relating to selection of jurors. Adds subsection establishing rules for changing jurors' addresses. (04/08/96)

SB1258 Provides for direct payment of sales tax to the Oklahoma Tax Commission. (04/23/96)

SB1270 Defines "wireless telephone company" and "other telephone service company" as it applies to the Nine-One-One Emergency Number Act. (05/20/96)

SB1277 Authorizes and encourages the Director of the Oklahoma Department of Transportation to engage in negotiations regarding contracts for the use of certain rights of way. (04/17/96)

SB1303 Modifies membership of the Advisory Committee on Medical Care for Public Assistance Recipients. (05/21/96)

SB1314 Authorizes the granting of home health aide certification under specified circumstances. (05/07/96)

SB1315 Directs purchasing specifications and parameters relating to OneNet. (05/21/96)

SJR 30 Directs the Department of Transportation to place suitable markers on US Hwy. 81 to designate it as "Chisholm Trail Highway". (04/08/96)

SJR 34 Creates a special committee to study the county jails and sheriffs offices. (04/08/96)

SJR 35 Designates a portion of Oklahoma State Highway 74 as "The John N. Happy Camp Memorial Highway." (04/18/96)

SJR 37 Designates a twenty mile radius emanating from the relative intersection of I-35, I-40 and I-44 as "America's Corner." (05/07/96)

This bill diminishes the current safeguards to assure the protection of the public and the mentally ill from potentially inaccurate mental health evaluation by underqualified persons.
