Michael Authorizes any sheriff's office or campus police agency to dispose of by public sale, destruction, donation, or transfer for use to a governmental subdivision personal property which has come into its possession; provides procedure for the same; establishes special funds to hold proceeds of the sale of such property and authorizes expenditures from said fund.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. CCR Read - House, Called Up For Consideration, CCR Adopted - House, Fourth Reading - House, Bill Passed - House, CCR Submitted To Senate, CCR Read - Senate

HB2053 Principal Author(s): Blackburn, Debbie; Boyd, Laura W.; Brown, Ben; Cox, Kevin; Sadler, Al; Voskuhl, Sean; Weaver, Robert E. Modifies requirements for those involved in child abuse and neglect situations; requires criminal history investigations of foster parent applicants; provides for prompt medical treatment for abused children; provides for a special review application to be made after removing a child from custody; states that no child shall be placed in the custody of any individual subject to the Oklahoma Sex Offenders Registration Act; provides for legal representation for abused children; transfers responsibility of removed children with the Oklahoma Office of Juvenile Affairs; provides for review and approval of

training curricula; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Signed & Returned To House, Enrolled - House

HB2059 Principal Author(s): Boyd, Laura W.; Long, Ed Creates the Oklahoma Tuition Savings Account Act; provides aid and assistance in financing for postsecondary education; defines terms; allows residents to contribute to a tuition savings account not to exceed \$5,000; allows for adjustments in the Oklahoma taxable income and the Oklahoma adjusted gross income; provides for tax exemptions for contributions made after December 31, 1996.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. CCR Rejected, Further Conference Requested, Further Conference Granted, Second CCR Submitted To House

HB2086 Principal Author(s): Dunlap, James R.; Hendrick, Howard H. Deletes population requirements for cities and towns as they relate to the adoption of written investment policies.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Governor Action - Signed

HB2100 Principal Author(s): Rice, Larry; Wilkerson, Dick Allows for retired members of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Capitol Patrol or Lake Patrol to purchase the sidearm and shotgun or rifle issued to them; allows for the cost of the weapon to be obtained by the State Purchasing Director.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Signed & Transmitted To Governor

HB2101 Principal Author(s): Begley, Jack; Capps, Gilmer N.; Ferguson, Larry R. Allows officers or employees of a municipality with a population of more than 2,500 to conduct business with said municipality; allows members of any board of education of a municipality with a population of over 2,500 to furnish materials or supplies to said municipality; allows members of any board of education within a municipality with a population of more than 2,500 to vote on contracts between area vocational-technical schools and the entity by which the member is employed.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Second CCR Submitted To House

HB2115 Principal Author(s): Breckinridge, Flint; Smith, Jerry L. Modifies condition by which murder in the first degree occurs in certain circumstances.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Governor Action - Signed
