HB2100 Principal Author(s): Rice, Larry; Wilkerson, Dick; Allows for retired members of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Capitol Patrol or Lake Patrol to purchase the sidearm and shotgun or rifle issued to them; allows for the cost of the weapon to be obtained by the State Purchasing Director. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB2170 Principal Author(s): Hutchison, Joe; Shurden, Frank; Changes quail season hunting dates to the first Saturday in November to January 31. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB2179 Principal Author(s): Hendrick, Howard H.; Thomas Tommy; Allows the Oklahoma Health Care Authority to accept federal grant money to augment programs within its jurisdiction to reimburse the state for any such assistance payments; allows the authority to make apportionments with said funds. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/09/96**

HB2188 Principal Author(s): Greenwood, Joan; Hendrick, Howard; Modifies the definition of "medical savings account" to include that which is offered by the State and Education Employees Group Insurance Board; allows any funds remaining in a medical savings account at the end of a tax year to remain in the account for future medical expenses; provides for payment of account funds to the account holder in the event of employees is no longer employed; also provides for an option to retain the account to a new employer without penalty; requires the board to offer a high deductible health benefit plan; provides employees participating in a deferred compensation plan the option of transferring those funds to a medical savings account. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB2279 Principal Author(s): Bastin, Gary; Brown, Ben; Exempts person over the age of sixty-five (65) from paying a fee for a traffic record summary furnished by the Department of Public Safety or a motor license agent. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB2323 Principal Author(s): Smith, Dale; Henry, Brad; Creates the "School District Budget Act." **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/13/96**

HB2637 Principal Author(s): Shurden, Frank; Smith, Bill; Relates to game and fish programs and licensing; extends and renames former programs, outlines hunting license fees and donation designation requirements. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/09/96**

HB2745 Principal Author(s): Adair, Larry E.; Stipe, Gene; Directs the Department of Transportation County Advisory Board to establish a maximum purchase allocation for participating counties and to establish an interest rate which may be charged on all leases or lease-purchase agreements. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/09/96**

SB587 Principal Author(s): Monson, Angela; Paulk, William; Includes advanced practice nurses in list of medical practitioners included in definition of prescription; includes advanced practices nurses in definition of licensed practitioner; specifies that advanced registered nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, certified nurse-midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetist, and advanced practice nurses such as nurses may not dispense drugs but may dispense professional samples; allows such nurses to diagnose, prescribe, distribute, and administer medicines, devices, or treat-

ments as defined by the Board of Nursing; requires such nurse practitioners to accept responsibility to practice in accepted manner for their profession. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

SB682 Principal Author(s): Dank, Odilia; Hendrick, Howard; Modifies property exemptions from ad valorem taxation. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

SB702 Principal Author(s): Cole, Helen; Davis, Frank; Provides penalties for any person selling low-point beer between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

SB838 Principal Author(s): Hamilton, James E.; Haney, Enoch Kelly; Hobson, Cal; Steidley, Dwayne; Appropriates supplemental funds to the State Board of Education, the State Supreme Court, the Court of Criminal Appeals, the Office of the State Treasurer and the office of the State Auditor and Inspector. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/09/96**

SB1017 Principal Author(s): Leist, M.C.; Shurden, Frank. States that the Troop Commander in charge of a highway patrol troop may designate specified portions of federal aid primary highways and the state highway system in the service area of the troop. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/09/96**

SB1185 Principal Author(s): Hastings, Chris; Smith, Jerry; Allows for destruction or donation of certain court records that have been microfilmed. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB1268 Relates to environment and natural resources; provides regulations and restrictions relating to recycling facilities. Eng. Sen. Amend. strikes the title. (04/09/96)

HB1555 Relates to state government; authorizes purchases of certain nonmedical, assistive technology - related items by State Department of Rehabilitative Services without competitive bid requirements (05/01/96)

HB1817 Authorizes expenditures from certain funds for certain purposes and limits the salary of the Director of the Department of Central Services; exempts certain employees from the merit system of Personnel Administration. (03/26/96)

HB1860 Relates to motor vehicles; doubles fines for speeding in construction zones. (04/29/96)

HB1880 Clarifies language relating to the dental profession. Creates and sets qualifications for a Board of Dentistry which is granted powers to enforce regulations and set standards of professional responsibility over the dental profession. (03/06/96)

HB1947 Modifies certain language and requirements relating to branch offices of banks and trust companies. (04/17/96)

HB1989 Allows public trusts to purchase materials and equipment from state contracts through central services. Originally modified duties of the district court judge in issuing certain instructions relating to acquisition of lands by purchase, donation or condemnation. (04/30/96)

HB2056 Requires the Department of Corrections to provide a place within the walls of the state prison at

McAlester so that members of the immediate family of any deceased victim of the defendant may witness the execution; requires the judge who presided at the trial and the chief of police of the municipality in which the crime occurred to witness the execution. (04/08/96)

HB2072 Modifies language as it relates to the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System. (04/09/96)

HB2082 Designates the black swallowtail as the state butterfly of Oklahoma. (04/01/96)

HB2084 Clarifies language as it relates to the selling of advertising in Oklahoma Today Magazine. (04/23/96)
