

Executive Action – Signed

HB2620 Creates the Construction Division within the Department of Corrections. (05/14/96)

HB2622 Provides criminal penalty for any person falsely executing a written declaration as a witness or misrepresenting his or her identity with the intent to defraud, relevant to the execution of self-proved wills and codicils. (04/18/96)

HB2623 States that a group or combination of persons or risks shall not be considered a "fictitious" group upon meeting the conditions provided within this section. (04/09/96)

HB2637 Relates to game and fish programs and licensing. Extends and renames former programs, outlines hunting license fees and donation designation requirements.

HB2642 Exempts the sale of Oklahoma Magazine and production of merchandise for resale from the Central Purchasing Act; states that specified services for the production of Oklahoma Today magazine shall also be exempt from said act; extends petty cash fund usage to include the payment of bank charges and the purchasing of beverage and vending licenses. (05/20/96)

HB2666 States the dues and fees to YMCA's or YWCA's for the use of facilities or services for persons under age 16 are exempt from sales tax. (04/18/96)

HB2669 Authorizes National Park Service rangers to make arrests with the same status as state or local law enforcement if it is believed the offender has committed a felony, misdemeanor or at the request of a law enforcement officer. (04/08/96)

HB2697 Removes Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation employees from exemption from the Polygraph Examiners Act; requires OSBI polygraphers to be licensed under the Act. (04/03/96)

HB2725 States that taxpayers with a taxable income of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) in at least one (1) of the three (3) last taxable years may compute tax on an annual basis. (04/08/96)

HB2726 Authorizes local school districts and county or city-county health departments may enter into agreements related to assuring that a child who is returning to school after an absence due to head lice infection is no longer afflicted. (04/08/96)

HB2735 Clarifies language relating to the civil rights of prisoners. (05/14/96)

HB2745 Directs the Department of Transportation County Advisory Board to establish a maximum purchase allocation for participating counties and to establish an interest rate which may be charged on all leases or lease-purchase agreements. (05/15/96)

HB2754 Modifies membership qualifications of the Board of Trustees of the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics. (04/09/96)

HB2796 Provides that recordable instruments shall be written and printed in English and presented in a certain manner. (05/20/96)

HB2798 Stipulates that at renewal the Oklahoma Linked Deposit Review Board may approve an increase in the amount of principal if the business is expanding and additional jobs will be created. (04/15/96)

HB2807 Establishes April 19th of every year as Oklahoma City Bombing Remembrance Day. (04/04/96)

HB2813 Permits counties to submit sealed bids to purchase equipment from the state or any agency or political subdivision of this state. (04/08/96)

HB2824 Establishes appropriations to the State Board of Education for midterm supplements to State Aid to school districts from the Rainy Day Fund and makes other appropriations from the Rainy Day Fund. (05/21/96)

HB2830 Appropriates funds to the State Treasurer, Water Resources Board and Department of Transportation for the Rural Economic Action Program. (05/21/96)

HB2899 Modifies the powers, duties and responsibilities of the Oklahoma International Trade Development Council. (04/09/96)

HB2901 Allows counties reimbursement for volunteer training expenses. Allows a county sheriff to charge \$5.00 per card for fingerprinting individuals. Allows sheriff to deduct money from the Inmate Trust Fund Checking Account to cover medical co-payment's for medical services rendered while incarcerated and for copies requested by an inmate from the Inmate Trust Fund Checking Account. (04/18/96)

HB2918 Provides for assistant and special assistant district attorneys to be named state officers and details responsibilities of the position. (04/03/96)

HB2921 Adds certain types of telecommunication companies to subject to the Corporation Commissions public utilities assessment. (04/16/96)

HB2930 Modifies penalties relating to eluding or attempting to elude a peace officer. (04/18/96)

HB2934 Modifies definitions relating to the Health Care Freedom of Choice Act. Requires certain policies be brought into compliance and clarifies compliance. (04/12/96)

HB2937 Modifies permissible duration of contracts with private prison contractors and provides limitations. (05/14/96)

HB2950 Modifies language pertaining to private prison facilities. (04/08/96)

HB2962 Clarifies language within the Oklahoma Children's Code to address compulsory school attendance. (04/08/96)

HB2971 Clarifies language pertaining to the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System. Distinguishes adopted children from biological children with regard to benefits. Defines beneficiary. (05/21/96)

HB2988 Authorizes the State Board of Agriculture to establish fees; provides for other surety allowable for livestock markets by the US Packers and Stockyards Act; and provides penalties upon the suspension, revocation, or expiration of livestock auction market licenses. Defines livestock and exotic animals. (05/16/96)

HB2989 Allots portions of the Waste Tire Recycling Indemnity Fund. (05/14/96)

HB3000 Declares "Oklahoma My Native Land" the official children's song of the state. (04/03/96)

HB3006 Modifies required deadlines for authorization to establish branch banks. (04/08/96)

HB3021 Requires individual and group insurance policies to provide coverage for equipment, services and supplies for treatment of diabetes. (04/23/96)

HB3024 Modifies various sections of the Oklahoma Self Defense Act. (02/22/96)

HB3027 Modifies various sections pertaining to the Oklahoma Consumer Protection Act and the Perpetual Case Fund Act. (03/19/96)

HB3028 States that any written bill of sale, timber deed or timber contract shall be preserved by the owner or operator of a logging or timber harvesting operation for at least a period of three (3) years. Within said time frame, law enforcement personnel may inspect records. (04/03/96)

HB3037 Requires environmental agencies to promulgate rules to establish penalties to be imposed against any person who knowingly makes a false complaint or who knowingly misrepresents or omits material information relating to the complaint or who knowingly misrepresents or omits material information relating to the complaint. (05/10/96)

HJR1074 Designates Dec. 7 of each year as "Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day." (04/08/96)

HJR1077 Designates US Hwy. 64 from Pawnee west to US Hwy. 177 shall be designated as the "Pawnee Bill Memorial Highway." (04/03/96)

HJR1087 Creates the State Government Internal Affairs Investigation Review Committee. (04/17/96)
