**HB1780** Principal Author(s): Hamilton, James E.; Haney, Enoch Kelly; Makes an appropriation to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology; makes those appropriations subject to fiscal year limitations.; Effective Date: 09/01/96.05/30/96, Governor Action - Line Item Veto.

**HB1782** Principal Author(s): Hamilton, James E.; Haney, Enoch Kelly; Relates to the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology; limits the salary of the Director and states certain budget categories.; .05/30/96, Governor Action - Veto.
