SB 911 Principal Author(s): Easley, Kevin A.; Rice, Larry Defines "economically at-risk wells" to include any oil or natural gas producing property which produces 3 barrels or less of oil or 30,000 cubic feet of gas per day unless the weighted average wellhead price of Oklahoma oil exceeds \$20 calculated on an annual calendar year basis or the weighted average wellhead price of Oklahoma gas exceeds \$2.50 per Million British Thermal Units calculated on an annual calendar year basis.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Second CCR Submitted To Senate, Second CCR Read - Senate

SB 1017 Principal Author(s): Leist, M. C.; Shurden, Frank States that the Troop Commander in charge of a highway patrol troop may designate specified portions of federal aid primary highways and the state highway system in the service area of the troop.; Governor Action - Veto

SB 1050 Principal Author(s): Shurden, Frank; Stanley, Fred Modifies language relating to firearms.; Emergency. Signed & Transmitted To Governor

SB 1077 Principal Author(s): Long, Ed; Wells, Dale W. Modifies statutory sections pertaining to itemization of expenditures, responsibilities of Department of Central Services, and boards of education.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Called Up For Consideration, CCR Adopted - Senate, Fourth Reading - Senate, Bill And Emergency Passed - Senate, Signed & Transmitted To House, Second CCR Submitted To House

SB 1082 Principal Author(s): Hilliard, Danny; Weedn, Trish Grants authority for certain part time employment within specified cities and towns by off duty police officers.; Emergency. Second CCR Submitted To Senate, Second CCR Read - Senate, Second CCR Adopted - Senate, Fourth Reading - Senate, Bill And Emergency Passed - Senate, Signed & Transmitted To House, Second CCR Submitted To House

SB 1106 Principal Author(s): Herbert, Dave; Roberts, Larry D. Modifies sections pertaining to the Oklahoma State and Education Employee Group Insurance Board and the Oklahoma State Employees Benefits Council; prohibits the Board from offering a health plan which is owned or operated by the state and which utilizes a capitated payment plan for providers which uses a primary care physician as a gatekeeper to any specialty care provided by physician-specialists, unless specifically authorized by the Legislature.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. CCR Rejected, Further Conference Requested, Further Conference Granted, Second CCR Submitted To Senate, Second CCR Read - Senate

SB 1147 Principal Author(s): Benson, Loyd L.; Shedrick, Bernice Prohibits the use of accident reports for commercial purposes.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. Called Up For Consideration, CCR Adopted - Senate, Fourth Reading - Senate, Bill Passed - Senate, Signed & Transmitted To House, Second CCR Submitted To House

SB 1152 Principal Author(s): Easley, Kevin A.; Hefner, Jerry W. Creates the Substance Abuse Prevention Program. Provides guidelines for children in need of supervision or delinquent.; Effective Date: 11/01/96. CCR Rejected, Further Conference Requested, Further Conference Granted

SB 1209 Principal Author(s): Askins, Jari; Helton, Sam Modifies references relating to vehicle inspection fees.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. Second CCR Submitted To Senate, Second CCR Read - Senate

SB 1227 Principal Author(s): Robinson, Ben H.; Stanley, Fred Extends benefits of the State and Education Employees Group Health and Life Insurance to board members of any rural water, sewer, gas or solid waste management district or nonprofit water corporation.; Effective Date: 07/01/96 Emergency. CCR Rejected, Further Conference Requested, Further Conference Granted

SB 1270 Principal Author(s): Long, Lewis Jr.; Satterfield, Shelby Defines "wireless telephone company" and "other telephone service company" as it applies to the Nine-One-One Emergency Number Act.; Emergency. CCR Read - House, Called Up For Consideration, CCR Adopted - House, Fourth Reading - House, Bill And Emergency Passed - House, Signed & Returned To Senate, Enrolled - Senate

SB 1315 Principal Author(s): Anthony, Calvin J.; Robinson, Ben H. Directs purchasing specifications and parameters relating to OneNet.; Emergency. Signed & Transmitted To Governor

SCR 64 Principal Author(s): Benson, Loyd L.; Hobson, Cal Authorizes the Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma acting on behalf of the University of Oklahoma to issue revenue bonds.; Senate Introduction And First Reading

HB2053 Principal Author(s) Blackburn, Debbie; Boyd, Laura; Brown, Ben; Cox, Kevin; Sadler, Al; Voskuhl, Sean; Weaver, Robert. Modifies requirements for those involved in child abuse and neglect situations; requires criminal history investigations of foster parent applicants; provides for prompt medical treatment for abused children; provides for a special review application to be made after removing a child from custody; states that no child shall be placed in the custody of any individual subject to the Oklahoma Sex Offenders Registration Act; provides for legal representation for abused children; transfers responsibility of removed children with the Oklahoma Office of Juvenile Affairs; provides for review and approval of training curricula. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/15/96**

HB2100 Principal Author(s): Rice, Larry; Wilkerson, Dick; Allows for retired members of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Capitol Patrol or Lake Patrol to purchase the sidearm and shotgun or rifle issued to them; allows for the cost of the weapon to be obtained by the

State Purchasing Director. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB2170 Principal Author(s): Hutchison, Joe; Shurden, Frank; Changes quail season hunting dates to the first Saturday in November to January 31. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB2188 Principal Author(s): Greenwood, Joan; Hendrick, Howard; Modifies the definition of "medical savings account" to include that which is offered by the State and Education Employees Group Insurance Board; allows any funds remaining in a medical savings account at the end of a tax year to remain in the account for future medical expenses; provides for payment of account funds to the account holder in the event of employees is no longer employed; also provides for an option to retain the account to a new employer without penalty; requires the board to offer a high deductible health benefit plan; provides employees participating in a deferred compensation plan the

option of transferring those funds to a medical savings account. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB2279 Principal Author(s): Bastin, Gary; Brown, Ben; Exempts person over the age of sixty-five (65) from paying a fee for a traffic record summary furnished by the Department of Public Safety or a motor license agent. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/14/96**

HB2637 Principal Author(s): Shurden, Frank; Smith, Bill; Relates to game and fish programs and licensing; extends and renames former programs, outlines hunting license fees and donation designation requirements. **SIGNED & TRANSMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR - 05/09/96**

HB2988 Principal Author(s): Leist, M.C.; Muegge, Paul. Authorizes the State Board of Agriculture to establish fees; provides for other surety allowable for livestock markets by the US Packers and Stockyards Act;
