needed treatment;*

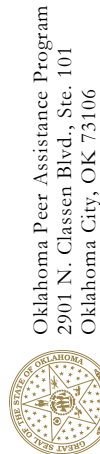
*Help in preserving

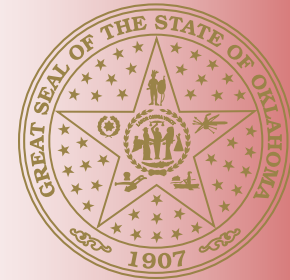
