

Did you know...Oklahoma Abstractors are bonded to the State of Oklahoma and covered by an errors and omissions policy. They are financially responsible for the accuracy of their products and services.

Did you know...that land titles in Oklahoma derived from two very distinct sources? Many land titles passed from the United States government directly into private ownership through the issuance of a homestead patent. Other land titles passed from the United States either in trust for the various Indian tribes, directly to the tribe, or directly into private ownership by the individual tribal member, depending upon the specific treaty between the tribe and the United States government.

Did you know...that there are more than 50 ways a land title can be transferred from one owner to another in Oklahoma? Abstractors maintain the chain of title regarding important information about events which may affect your land ownership.

Did you know...to obtain an abstract, you must use an abstract company that is in the county where the property is located.
